Report from Chris Seeto: 14/8/19

Thanks everyone for attending. Tonight we put forward a recommendation to support the school and Ms Verinder's plan to transform the Quad area outside the library, into a sensory playground. It's been a long term plan of Ms Verinder's since joining the school and is in part a response to a call for more activities for the children to do during their recess and lunch-break. With more activities brings more social interaction, which are great skills for the kids to continue their development.

The figure contribution from the P&C will be \$75,000, which is larger than any single spend we've ever done in the past. However, in the past five years, we have been maintaining a very consistent income from fundraising, due to the efforts of all the parents at the school. Our general bank account currently holds over \$140,000 of funds and it is in our interest to use this whilst our children are still at the school.

Term 2 was big again, thanks to the busy month of May, with both Mother's Day events, the REPS Music Festival, and a federal election thrown in. For their ownership, efforts and energy we would like to thank:

- And special thanks to Pavan and Jayani Samaranayake, and Marty Webb for volunteering to be the parent representative on recent teacher selection panels.
- And to Kelly Centellas, Terese, Tonya and Lisa for organising all the appliance purchases and canteen upgrade logisitics. Without the efforts of all these volunteers we would not be in a position to be able to contribute to this upgrade in the school.

I've named the people above because as volunteers they've taken on the role of owning and coordinating those particular events. Yes it is important for the P&C to have many volunteers on the days of the events, but even more vital are the people who put in the few hours in the weeks prior to ensure the events can happen. Organising these events isn't always a huge time commitment. Most of them have run successfully for many years and the parents who have run them are still at the school to ensure that they are put together smoothly and efficiently. But please remember, all these roles are voluntary and are filled by people who have given up their own time to perform them.

Simply, without event or program co-ordinators, it will not be possible for us to run the event or program.

There are many positions vacant for next year, and some which will affect the school greatly, if they are not filled.



Music Committee Head

Lina Diaz has done an incredible job running the Music sub-committee for the past three years. From the outset, she pledged to lead it for three years and from January next year, we will need someone to step into her role.

The P&C music program at the school co-ordinates all the extra-curricular music tuition, the ensembles, and any of the live music performances, whether they be at an assembly or at the Opera House.

Lina's efforts in growing this music program every year has seen a massive benefit to the school, with around a third of all children at Ryde East enrolled in it. The music program has become a reason why parents choose Ryde East for their children. So firstly, thank you Lina and your music committee team for your dedication and passion for this musical education program. Lina's youngest daughter is in Year 1, so she'll continue to be a member of the music sub-committee and be available for support for many more years.

Because of how well Lina has performed her role, we are left with quite a large problem to solve. As an executive team, we met with Lina to discuss the potential solutions.

The first and most obvious one is to find another parent to volunteer in her role.

The second solution would be to look at scaling back the music program to the "essentials" to suit a new co-ordinator's time commitment.

Another solution would be to look at splitting up the role Lina performed, into smaller parts, distributed amongst more people, but of course this would mean having to source more volunteers.

Or the last option would be to look at bringing in a music program co-ordination company (which many school's do) or financially incentivising the role.

The time to find a new co-ordinator is now, so I'd like to ask everyone to try and help recruit for this postion. If you are interested, or think you know someone who has a passion for music and music education, please approach them. We're lucky we'll have Lina around many more years and it's *always* possible to find a solution to fit the role to their time commitment.

Nicole Shore is looking into the costs for the paid solution, which will be our last resort, as we don't particularly want to see tuition costs rise, or the music program to disappear.

Semester 1 School Reports

WIFI Upgrade

We have had our WIFI throughout the school upgraded at a cost of approx.. \$15 000. This is to ensure that students can effectively use the iPads and technology with all devices. Each WIFI port now supplies enough WIFI for 30-40 devices.

School Tours

Kindergarten School Tours have been conducted with approx., 25-30 parents attending. We currently have approx. 40 local area enrolments for 2020.

Staff are in the process of deciding on 7 Learning Dispositions and then teaching them to the students through explicit lessons.



Education Week - Art Show and Open Day

Thank you to the P&C for organising the Art Show evening event and coordinating the food and drink. Thank you to all the parent volunteers and Lisa and Tonia in the canteen. The evening was a hit.

All of the whole-class artwork sold in the silent auction, which was great!

Open day saw lots of parents, grandparents and visitors which was lovely to see.

Athletics Carnival

Thank you to Steve Barlow and Brian for all of their support in the organisation and on the day. Thank you to Steve for supporting the running of the 800 metre races today as well. Thank you to Joshua Hurkett who organised the whole-school event.

Further Updates:

Carpark:

Please be aware that the two carparks on the school site, the one at Badajoz Rd and the other at Twin Rd, **are for staff only**. There has been an agreement with the school in the past that the carpark on Badajoz Rd is available for parents picking up and dropping off children to OOSH prior to 8am and after 4pm. As the new fence has been put up and there is not a permanent lock been placed on the gate, parents have been accessing this carpark outside of these hours, leaving the gates open or reopening the gates to gain access and also parking unsafely or having children walking through the carpark.

It is extremely important that you utilise this carpark with in the guidelines that have been provided to you. This access was then also reduced again with the refurbishment of the canteen. We asked parents not to access this carpark after 7:30am in the mornings, during this time due to the reduced number of parking spaces and the construction that would be taking place. This has also not been adhered to.

As the carpark is not being used correctly or safely by parents at the moment, I am now asking you not to park in this carpark at this stage. Thank you for your understanding on this matter. Student and staff safety is our number one priority.



School Carpark Discussion key points

- Very emotive issue extra time /stressful people feeling locked out of school -
- Q re Local residents had there been any communication with them about the change as prior events run at school early in the morning had caused complaints due to parking issues
- Parking for teachers limited on grounds generally.

F Block Upgrade:

We have just been informed that 'F' Block (our current Year 1 and Year 3 classrooms) will be upgraded over the next couple of months. This will involve classrooms being repainted, doors being replaced internally and externally, ceiling, floor coverings, lights and fans will be replaced. This will mean that there will be some disruption to students and staff being able to access this building for a period of time. The construction company are going to complete two classrooms at a time so that it will have the least impact on the students' environment. This may mean that during this time classes may be relocated to another space in the school whilst this is happening. As we do not have a definite start date as yet, I will keep you informed as we go along. Another exciting upgrade for our school!

Canteen:

At this stage we are hoping that the canteen will be handed over to us early next week, at this stage we have not been given confirmation of this, so we are still unsure as to when the canteen will reopen. We are hoping for it to be Monday Week 7, but this cannot be confirmed as yet and we do not want to advertise this to the parents until it is confirmed.

Asphalt:

You will have noticed that the fencing around the boundary of the school is also most complete, which is great! We have also had a large area of the school re-asphalted over the school holidays. In the coming weeks they will place silver seats in this area and also paint some games on the ground for the students.



The REPS Music Program has had a busy start to this term. FOIM has been a huge success and we acknowledge the efforts of Miss Freer with the organising, Mr Ward with transport and supervision on the day as well as previously with the combined rehearsal, and to the school executive for their continued support of the program.

This term we have already had the Performance band involved in Education Week, performing at assembly, later this term they will also perform at one of the Kindy 2020 events, the NSW Schools Bands and Orchestra Festival at UNSW and in Early term 4 the Granny Smith Festival. We have a number of other performances organised for this term at community events as well as school events which will see most ensembles perform.

Due to lack of volunteers for other jobs which I am covering, as well as time constraints there was no participation from REPS at the Ryde Eisteddfod this year.

OSCH staff have been taking students to their lessons and collecting them afterwards when necessary since last term. Even though we had some teething issues at the start, these were quickly sorted, and the system has been running very smoothly since then. Thanks to Parthi and all the staff at OSCH for their efforts as this change has vastly improved the lessons for the children.

We have a number of performances planned for this year and planning is well underway for the Musical Variety Night (29th November) with the pieces for the Orchestra already selected and some students already working on their parts. We will have a Term 3 concert (like last year) on the 12th of September, with a focus on our Percussion cohort and which provides the opportunity for soloists / duets from all year groups. This is especially encouraged for students preparing for AMEB examinations. The guitar ensembles and Rock band will be performing on this date.

Creative kids Vouchers: Parents have saved \$7500 through the use of these vouchers. Some of the tutors have also gained their own approvals, so parents now have the added flexibility of choosing whether they want to use their voucher towards the Program fees or tuition fees for some instruments.

We welcome Zoe Field who will take over from Jodie Giles as the Recorder Contact Parent for 2020, and Rupert Su as the strings contact parent effective as when I do a hand over. We do have several parents either leaving school or wanting to change roles at the end of the year, so the positions that will require filling will be:

- Music Program Coordinator
- Treasurer
- Secretary
- Woodwind Contact Parent
- Music Practice Rewards

Planning for next year is happening now, so we need parents to step up so that the program can continue to run with minimal changes for the students.



Our current balance in the music account is a \$19,054.85, of which we will need to put some of this towards the continuing servicing of all instruments.

Tutor fees have remained the same for this year to \$40 per solo half hour lesson. The annual \$100 fee and the weekly band fee of \$8.50 remained the same. The Ensembles were charged a weekly fee of \$10. The percussion students were also charged a \$10 fee to cover wear and tear and servicing of percussion equipment. The Band and Ensemble fee is used to cover the cost of the conductors. We request a price increase for the band from \$8.50 per rehearsal to \$10, in line with the other ensembles for 2020 and further for an increase in lessons to \$41 per solo half hour lesson and a pro rata increase from current rates for the group lessons.

I would like to ask the P&C for funds to purchase a subscription for "Simply Book Me" an online web based app to aid us with the timetabling for lessons for next year. The cost is expected to be \$300 USD per year for the number of bookings that we need to cover. The software can be used for other P&C activities like scheduling of sporting lessons or even organising volunteers.

I also ask for approval up to \$3000 for the purchase of at least 3 cellos in varying sizes (1/4, 1/2 and possibly 3/4 or full sized) to hire out to new students.

Finally, I would like to thank our Principal, Deputy Principal and Miss Freer for all their assistance, and all the teachers whose classrooms are being used for instrumental lessons.

Grounds

The Year 1 working bee was well attended with over 70 adults and children. The roof workers' barriers were down so it was easier for us to get around and do lots of tasks... but now there is no access to the canteen, so we had morning tea on the tables outside the front of the hall. This worked out very well. Working bees for this term will be Sunday 25 August - Year 4, and Sunday 22 September - Year 2.

On National Tree Day For Schools the Ryde East Natural Environment Group planted native shrubs and groundcovers in the area between the side fence and the new path out to Badajoz Rd. This will not only reduce the need for mowing (thus saving our school both time and money) but also enhance the small native bird habitat value of our grounds.

We plan to plant the remaining shrubs and ground covers in the area behind the library, where it is no longer possible for the ride-on lawnmower to gain access.

In conclusion, I reiterate that the Grounds Committee was once a committee! It would be good to have at least three P&C members contributing ideas and sharing contacts / resources so our ideas and efforts are representative of our whole school community, including principal and staff. Anyone interested please let me know; aim is not to have regular meetings but simply to come together for decision-making as needed. Lately this has been done in informal discussions between Katrina, Greg and me.

School Watch

Once again there have been no untoward activities reported, but at the beginning of the school holidays we found 6 windows and 2 doors unlocked, then many days later during the holidays the library and hall were found to be open, with lights on inside the hall. Thanks to the diligence of some newer team members, I was alerted and addressed these issues. Sometimes doors and windows may seem to be shut and locked when they are not (latest being the library side emergency door last Monday night) so the school watch team's work remains valuable for the security of our school.



Thomas Family – a REPS family has been affected due to unexpected health complications for one of the mum's.
