Sport Program

Kindergarten attend PE once a week with Mr Hurkett. During this time students learn about and play different sports, practise fundamental movement skills and learn how to use sporting equipment safely.

Students learn to follow rules and play fairly while participating in group games and challenges.





PSSA

PSSA stands for Primary School Sports Association. Schools are placed into zones and compete against other schools in their zone on a Friday afternoon.

PSSA sports include; soccer, AFL, netball, softball, cricket and Tiger Tag.

PSSA starts for students in Year 3.





Sports Carnivals

Kindergarten students participate in the school's annual cross country and athletics carnival.

The cross country carnival is usually held at the end of Term 1 on the school grounds. The Kindergarten students run one lap of the school.

The Athletics carnival is usually held in Term 3. The Kindergarten children participate in novelty events like the parachute, egg and spoon race and sack races to name a few as well as running a 70m race.
















Extra Curricular Programs

The school coordinates events such as Jump Rope for Heart, Gymnastics programs, and Sporting Schools Grants to run additional programs to promote Health and Wellbeing.














Sporting Schools Program

The Environmental Group is led by Mr Philip Ward. The students go on local bush walks down into the Field of Mars or work on environmental projects in the school grounds.






Environmental Group





Student Representative Council (SRC)
