There will be the usual tasks which include:

- Rotary-hoeing the soft-fall material around the playground equipment
- Clearing fallen branches and any rubbish from around the school grounds
- Shredding dead leaves and branches
- Weeding gardens and spreading mulch
- Mowing and brush-cutting long grass near trees and fences
- Cleaning playground drains and along the kerbs
- Washing playground seats and tables
- Pressure cleaning metal seats, Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) and tennis courts
