## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Planning for 2020

We have begun planning for 2020 in terms of classes and student numbers. #### **Class Placement Requests for 2020**

We are currently discussing and arranging class placements for our students in 2020. These discussions have begun as there are many different options for class structures to consider for K-6. While staff are aware of most situations that may impact on class placement, there are **always** circumstances or concerns that you as parents have. For this reason, if you have any major concerns about your child's class placement for 2020, please send a letter outlining your concerns in an envelope marked 'Confidential: Attention School Principal' by **Friday 8 November 2019.** Please do not request a particular teacher for your child. I would like to remind all parents that any decisions relating to class teachers are based on a range of school factors. Whilst each concern is considered, we are unable to guarantee that requests will be accommodated. If you have sent in a request in previous years that is still a concern, please send it in again as only current requests will be considered.

#### Organisation for beginning of 2020

Please be aware that students in Years 1 to 6 will return to school on Wednesday 29 January. On this day we will hold a whole-school assembly on the asphalt area (space between the current Kindergarten and Year 2 rooms) at 9:15am. We will welcome families and students back to school after the holidays. As in 2019, we will not be forming our 2020 classes until later that week or early the following week. As with 2019's organisation, we will not know our definite Kindergarten enrolment numbers until Friday 31 January and, due to the fact that our class compositions are made up based on the number of students we have at the school, this information is vital before officially forming classes.

Students will remain with their 2019 classroom teacher for this period of time, which will also assist them in transiting smoothly to their 2020 classes with the support of their teacher and known peers.

2020 Kindergarten students will have their Best Start Assessment on the Wednesday, Thursday or Friday of the first school week and then begin school on Monday 3 February at 9:15am.



Welcome back for Term 4 School banking; hope you all had a great holiday.

Term 4 rewards items have been released! You can also still order from Term 3, Term 2 and Term 1.

#### To assist us in processing your child's banking please remember the following:

- ensure all details are complete, writing neatly on both the <u>deposit slip</u> and the <u>deposit stub</u>.
- include your child's <u>Branch number</u>, account <u>number</u> and <u>student number</u> on every deposit slip. These are the key identifier of your child in the banking system. If you are a new banker, we will issue you a student number.
- use a <u>blue</u> or <u>black</u> pen –slips are not to be written in pencil or red pen please.
- no foreign coins please these will be returned, and the deposit adjusted.
- keep tokens at home so that there is no confusion on whether tokens have been issued.
- pop the money being deposited into the Velcro pouch please <u>do not include</u> additional zip lock bags because they can get lost in transfer.
- Only 1 deposit per child is allowed per week.

**Please note:** Children must collect the tokens from their own banking activities, there is no token pooling or sharing. The Commonwealth Bank also keeps a running total of token balances – so if your child has lost any tokens or you are not sure of their balance - just pop a note in with their bank book and we will find out their balance for you.

Remember 10 Silver tokens = 1 Gold token and reward And the gold tokens are for the child to keep at home.

#### **OOSH NEWS**


