Welcome to Week 4 of Term 4. Firstly I would like to thank our students and parents who are currently using 'Kiss and Ride'. When I was out there this week, the students were lined up in single file along the fence waiting patiently for their parents/carers, they were ensuring that the footpath was clear for pedes-trians and they were entering their cars safely. Presentation Day

Presentation day will be held on Wednesday 11 December.

Year 3-6 presentation assembly will take place from 9:30am and the K-2 presentation assembly will take place from 11:45am in the school hall. We have made some changes to the awards that will be given on presentation day. Please see below for the details:

- 2019 will see the introduction of an 'Academic Achievement Award', one student in each class K-6 will receive this award.
- Teachers in K-2 will then present 4 awards (2 x book awards and 2 x merit certificates) to the students in their class.
- Teachers in Years 3-6 will then present 5 awards (2 x book awards and 3 x merit certificates) to the students in their class.
- The book awards and merit certificates will be given for various reasons.
- 2019 will also see the introduction of **Kindergarten Graduation Certificates**, each student in Kindergarten will be presented with a certificate for completing their first year of schooling.
- We will also introduce a 'Music Excellence Award', which will be presented to one student in each year group K-6 and a 'Sportsmanship Award' that will be presented to one student in each year group K-6. These awards are based on the student's participation in the school-based programs that we are currently running.


OOSH NEWS
