Meet the Teacher

It was great to see so many parents attending our Meet the Teacher event on Monday evening. We thank you for coming to share in your child's journey through their education. If you weren't able to attend, there will be further information put onto the school website and handouts that were provided that can be collected from your child's class teacher. Thank you to all of the staff at Ryde East PS for your dedication and commitment in running after hours events.

Gold Card Assembly

Our first Gold card assembly will be held on **Wednesday 27 February**. At this assembly, we will also present the SRC students and Sports Captains with their badges. If you have merit awards to hand in to receive your Gold Card, please ensure they are put into the box in the Administration office **by Thursday 21 February**.

Individual Health Care Plans

It is extremely important that we maintain up-to-date and accurate information about students' medical conditions within the school. If you have indicated that your child has a medical/health condition, we are required to meet with you every year to complete an Individual Health Care Plan. Classroom teachers have sent home a copy of this document if it is required to be completed. Once you have filled in this documentation, we are asking you to make an appointment with your child's class teacher to go through the information.

This is also an opportunity to ensure that your child's medication is in date and their current ASCIA or Asthma plan is updated if needed. These are required to be updated by a Doctor every 12 months. A copy of this is then kept with your child's medication to ensure all the necessary steps are taken should we need to administer medication.

We would like to have this information updated by the end of Week 6 (Friday 8 March), so please ensure you have met with your child's class teacher by then.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT (continued)

If you have recently been made aware that your child has a medical condition that the school is not aware of, please ensure that you inform your child's class teacher so that we can follow up.

Raising Concerns

From time to time parents or other members of the school community may need to approach the school in order to:

Discuss the progress or welfare of their own child Express concern about actions of other students Enquire about school policy or practice Express concern about actions of staff

It is therefore necessary to have procedures that will help solve problems as soon as possible so that a safe and harmonious school environment is maintained. The best results occur from working together.

These guidelines aim to:

Provide a guide in order that concerns are dealt with in an open and fair manner Ensure that the rights of students, teachers and parents are respected and upheld Support sensitivity and confidentiality Help reach an agreed solution

On occasion, concerns may cause frustration and angst. At such times, it is always important to organise a time to talk with school staff at a mutually convenient time in a confidential atmosphere. At no stage should parents directly approach another person's child or other parents to discuss concerns.

Teachers, parents and community working together for successful schooling CONCERN	APPROPRIATE ACTION
The academic progress of your own child	Directly contact your child's teacher either by note, email, by telephone or in person to arrange a suitable time to discuss any issues.
The welfare of your own child	For minor issues directly contact your child's teacher to clarify information.
	For more serious concerns, contact the school. State the nature of concern and arrange a suitable time to talk with the class teacher, Assistant Principal of your child's stage or an appropriate staff member.
	To convey information about change of address, telephone number, emergency contact, custody details, health issues etc. Please contact the office.
Actions of other students	Contact the class teacher for a classroom or play- ground concern.
	If more serious, contact the school either through letter, email or telephone to speak to an Assistant Principal, the Deputy Principal or Principal about the matter.
School policy or practice	Contact the school. State the nature of the concern and make an appointment to see an Assistant Principal, the Deputy Principal or Principal.
Actions of a staff member	Contact the school and state concerns to the Deputy Principal or the Principal.

Specialist Religious Education (SRE) and Ethics (SEE)

Please be aware that SRE and SEE begin this Thursday 21 February. All students will be placed in classes based on their previous years' preference, unless you have received a note from the school requesting an update of information this year. If you did not receive a note and would like to change your child's SRE class, please notify the school in writing that you do not wish you child to attend SRE or to change their SRE nomination.

Attendance Monitoring

From the beginning of Week 5 (for students in Years 1 -6) we will begin to send an email notification to you to inform you that your child has not attended school that day. This email will be sent daily at approximately 10:30am. This will ensure all class teachers have an opportunity to mark the roll and the office to record any students who have arrived late to school.

If you know your child is going to be absent from school please contact the school office on 9878 3681 on the day.

If your child is currently in Kindergarten you will receive notification shortly on how to access the Sentral Parent Portal.

Kiss and Ride

As you may be aware, in 2018 Council approved two new dedicated School Zone Enforcement Officer positions for a period of two years. These two positions are now in place and will be patrolling the 28 schools in the City of Ryde on a roster basis for morning and afternoon school zone periods.

For the duration of February, when the new Enforcement Officers are patrolling primary schools, they will be focused on educating drivers on the parking and traffic rules, particularly around Kiss & Ride zones. They will issue warnings during this period and provide information on offenses and related fines, and safety tips to parents and carers.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT (continued)

From 4 March 2019, Council will adopt a zero tolerance approach to parking offenses in school zones. Fines will be issued for all infringements occurring within school zones.

We understand that parents can often be impatient and frustrated at the congestion and parking difficulties at school pick-up and drop-off times, but there are increasingly limited options to resolve these issues completely and they will only worsen as school enrolments and resident numbers increase. Therefore, we will be working with our Enforcement Officers, the Police and the Department of Education to target driver behaviour over the coming school year to try to instil a better understanding of the risks and consequences of ignoring road rules in school zones.



P&C MUSIC PROGRAM NEWS



LESSONS HAVE STARTED

All instrument lessons have now started, and we welcome all the new students to the music program, particularly those in kindergarten. Please make sure you read emails from your contact parent, they contain important information, and this is their main means of contact with students and parents regarding lesson and music program information.

The organising of the timetable is perhaps the most challenging part for the committee as we have over 150 enrolments in the program. Please take the time to thank your contact parent (especially if your child does percussion with nearly 80 enrolments) for the great job that they have done.

Ensemble rehearsals have been going well since week 2 and our Performance Band will be the first ones to give a performance to the school. It is important that children arrive on time as late arrivals cause disruption and it is at the beginning of the rehearsal that the conductors set the goals and give the instruction for what they need to cover.

As a reminder this is the rehearsal schedule:

Mondays - REPS Band 7:50am, Rock Band at lunch time

Tuesdays – Guitar Ensembles (Senior Guitars on even weeks, Junior Guitars on odd weeks), Junior String Ensemble, all at 7:50am

Wednesdays – Recorder Ensemble, Senior String Ensemble, both at 7:50am

Thursdays – Performance Band, 7:50am

If your child needs to be collected from OOSH for their instrumental lesson or for rehearsals, you need to notify your contact parent and complete the paperwork for Parthi as well.

SCHOOL BANKING

School Banking re-commenced on the 7th February, with Information/Welcome packs being sent out to all of our existing school bankers and our kindy families. The pack contains important information about school banking in 2019, along with the list of reward items for this year, plus redemption cards for completion once bankers are eligible for rewards.


If your child has not received a 2019 welcome pack, please pop into the office and collect one. Otherwise you can send us an email at schoolbanking.reps@gmail.com and we can arrange for one to be sent to your child's classroom.

To assist us in processing your child's banking please remember the following:

- ensure all details are complete, writing neatly on both the deposit slip and the deposit stub.
- include your child's <u>Branch number</u>, account <u>number</u> and <u>student number</u> on every deposit slip. These are the key identifier of your child in the banking system. If you are a new banker, we will issue you a student number.
- use a <u>blue</u> or <u>black</u> pen if slips are written in pencil or red pen we need to re-write them.
- no foreign coins please these will be returned and the deposit adjusted.
- <u>keep tokens at home</u> so that there is no confusion on whether or not tokens have been issued.
- pop the money being deposited into the Velcro pouch please <u>do not include</u> additional zip lock bags or envelopes as this slows down the process.

Only 1 deposit is allowed per week.

The example below indicates the fields that are required to be completed.



Please note: Children must collect the tokens from their own banking activities, there is no token pooling or sharing. The Commonwealth Bank also keeps a running total of token balances – so if your child has lost any tokens or you are not sure of their balance - just pop a note in with their bank book and we will find out their balance for you.

Remember when ordering reward items it can sometimes take up to 2 weeks for your child's order to arrive, so please be patient. If they have not received their reward item after 3 weeks, pop a note in with their banking and we will follow it up for you.


