CARPARK

Please be aware that the two carparks on the school site, the one at Badajoz Rd and the other at Twin Rd, are for staff only. There has been an agreement with the school in the past that the carpark on Badajoz Rd is available for parents picking up and dropping off children to OOSH prior to 8am and after 4pm. As the new fence has been put up and there is not a permanent lock on the gate, parents have been accessing this carpark outside of these hours, leaving the gates open or reopening the gates to gain access and also parking unsafely or having children walking through the carpark.

It is extremely important that you utilise this carpark within the guidelines that have been provided to you. This access was then also reduced again with the refurbishment of the canteen. We asked parents not to access this carpark after 7:30am in the mornings during this time due to the reduced number of parking spaces and the construction that would be taking place. This has also not been adhered to.

As the carpark is not being used correctly or safely by parents at the moment, I am now asking you not to park in this carpark at this stage. Thank you for your understanding on this matter. Student and staff safety is our number one priority.


