PSSA – Parent Support

Each Friday we have many students who represent our school at various PSSA sporting events. We are extremely proud of our students for their commitment to training, their dedication to continuing to improve and their great sportsmanship. Each of the students signs a Code of Conduct prior to representing our school in one of these teams.

Our teachers who volunteer their time to train these teams and support them at the games are also committed and dedicated to ensure that the students are prepared for these games and uphold the Ryde Zone PSSA Code of Behaviour.

Please be aware that staff who are coaching a PSSA team have clear guidelines to uphold throughout the PSSA games and when refereeing:

- Model expected behaviour
- Ensure all games are conducted in a fair and impartial manner
- Ensure the decisions of the referee / umpire are not questioned, by the students or parents
- Discourage coaching from the sideline
- Restrict coaching to half time and before and after the game
- Report all incidents of unfair or inappropriate behaviour by players, coaches/managers, spectators
- parents to the convenor as soon as possible

Please be aware that we expect the same behaviour from our parent spectators. We appreciate your support in attending the games to watch the students play. Please remember this is not a high level sporting competition; this is about students having-a-go and competing at level that is the best they can do as a team. It is about the student enjoying the game and having fun.

Please do not interfere in the game or comment on the referee decisions. Please do not coach from the side lines; none of these things will be tolerated and you will be asked to leave the grounds if this occurs. The students and teachers appreciate your encouragement and support at these games, but please ensure that it remains in the spirit of the game.

SCHOOL BANKING – TERM 2 REWARD ITEMS

School Banking continues every Thursday throughout Term 2!!!

Term 2 rewards items have been released!

Icicle Slapband Ruler



Yeti Fluffy Notebook



If your child has collected 10 tokens, they can now select the Icicle Slapband Ruler or the Yeti Fluffy Notebook as well as the Term 1 rewards items. Please note: Children must collect the tokens from their own banking activities, there is no token pooling or sharing. The Commonwealth Bank also keeps a running total of token balances – so if your child has lost any tokens or you are not sure of their balance - just pop a note in with their bank book and we will find out their balance for you.

Remember, when ordering reward items it can sometimes take up to 2 weeks for your child's order to arrive, so please be patient. If they have not received their reward item after 3 weeks, pop a note in with their banking and we will follow it up for you.

Parents please remember:

- ensure all details are complete, writing neatly on both the deposit slip and the deposit stub
- include your child's <u>student no.</u> on every deposit slip this is the key identifier for your child in the banking system
- use a blue or black pen if slips are written in pencil or red pen we need to re-write them
- no foreign coins please these will be returned and the deposit adjusted
- keep tokens at home so that there is no confusion on whether or not tokens have been issued
- pop the money being deposited into the Velcro pouch please <u>do not include</u> additional zip lock bags or envelopes as this slows down the process

Presentation: ADHD: Tweens to Teens and Beyond!

Dr Patrick Concannon, Developmental Paediatrician

This presentation by Dr Concannon, a Sydney-based Developmental Paediatrician, will focus on the changing support and needs of this age group; teenagers to adolescents and into young adults. Dr Concannon will discuss the importance of giving these children more understanding, what the passage is for teenagers, and how we can help them.

Dr Concannon has worked for over 40 years as a Developmental Paediatrician with a keen interest in ADHD and autism. He was the Service Director of the Lower North Shore and Ryde Child and Family Health Service before moving into private practice.
