#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **P&C Contribution**

I would like to thank the P&C and all parents at our school for your continued support of the school and our students. Whether you are active on the P&C committee, volunteer at P&C events or pay the voluntary contributions, you have assisted in ensuring that the P&C can significantly contribute to support your child's education and improve our school grounds.

A huge thank you to the parents who are on the P&C executive team and the parents who regularly attend the P&C meetings. Your input is invaluable. Thank you to parents who continuously dedicate their time to ensuring we foster the community spirit that has been such a great part of Ryde East Public School for many, many years.





This year so far the P&C has contributed \$30000 to technology, specifically to increase the number of iPads across the school and to purchase Apple TV devices to more easily connect the iPads to the interactive panels in the classroom. They have also contributed \$15000 to cover the cost of the new footpath, leading into the school from Badajoz Road, and \$3300 towards class-based items for teachers e.g. stickers, stamps etc.

This is a total of **\$48 300** of funds raised going towards benefiting our students and school. Thank you very much everyone!

In 2018, the P&C also contributed **\$6000** towards the PBL signage around the school, among other things. As we only had the signs put up this year, I wanted to ensure parents were aware of this.

#### **Carpark Safety**

As you are aware, carparks can be a dangerous place for children if they are not appropriately supervised. If you are using the Badajoz Road carpark to drop children off to OOSH in the mornings or pick up in the afternoons, please ensure that your child is supervised getting in and out of the car and walking with an accompanying adult when leaving or entering the carpark.

Please ensure that you do not walk your children through the carpark at any time. There are clear footpaths leading in and out of the school that are to be used by all pedestrians. It is extremely unsafe to be using the carpark as a walking path. Please help to keep your children safe at all times!

Please be aware that throughout the duration of the canteen upgrade there will be limited parking spaces available in the Badajoz Road carpark so it will be closed to all parents from 7:30am during this period of time. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.


#### **SPORTS NEWS**




#### SPOTLIGHT ON STEM LEGO CHALLENGE






ADHD: Tweens to Teens and Beyond!

Dr Patrick Concannon, Developmental Paediatrician

This presentation by Dr Concannon, a Sydney-based Developmental Paediatrician, will focus on the changing support and needs of this age group; teenagers to adolescents and into young adults. Dr Concannon will discuss the importance of giving these children more understanding, what the passage is for teenagers, and how we can help them.

Dr Concannon has worked for over 40 years as a Developmental Paediatrician with a keen interest in ADHD and autism. He was the Service Director of the Lower North Shore and Ryde Child and Family Health Service before moving into private practice. Dr Concannon is a leading authority on ADHD and is a life member of the Neurodevelopmental and Behavioural Paediatric Society of Australasia.
