Facebook

We have decided to use a social media platform to promote our school. We are currently in the process of designing a school Facebook Page. The purpose of this is to create a partnership between the school and community to positively promote teach-



ing and learning within the school, promote in-school activities and events, as well as excursions and camps. This will also provide us with a platform to promote the opportunities that students have by attending Ryde East PS and enable us to increase parent/community understandings of curriculum areas and school in general. We also intend to showcase our students' performances and extracurricular activities.

A substantial portion of our school funding this year has been used for school staff to engage in a considerable amount of professional learning in targeted areas to support the improvement of student learning outcomes. We would like to be able to strengthen the community's understanding of how staff professional learning directly benefits our students, and provide a platform for parents to see the types of lessons students are engaged in and the types of professional learning the staff are undertaking. We anticipate this will increase transparency of our core business of education.

This platform will be used to enhance information provided on the school website and in the school newsletter. We anticipate this will be up and running at the beginning of Term 2.

We will be sending home a permission to publish specially for the use of Facebook. We will be asking to use images of students, however their names will not be published with this, the description would explain the activity they are engaged with. You will not be 'tagged' in photos of your children, they will just be posted to the site. All posts will be monitored by school staff.

We are excited about this new opportunity to promote all the wonderful things that are happening at our school.

School Plan 2018 -2020

Our school has very clear Strategic Directions that we have outlined to achieve our School Plan priorities and initiatives over the next two years. Below I will outline our 2019 priorities for our *Strategic Direction* 2: Future Focussed Teaching and Learning.



Purpose:

To prepare students across all curriculum areas with skills and capabilities to thrive in a rapidly changing and interactive world, engaging a sense of curiosity. Teachers are flexible and select from a range of effective teaching strategies to enable students to be leaders in their learning.

Project-Based Learning / Key Enquiry Skills

In 2019 staff will implement the new Science, History and Geography syllabus documents.

All Staff will undertake Professional Learning in the area of Science at Field of Mars (\$3000) to support the implementation of this syllabus and promote outdoor experiences in the Living World.

All staff will undertake Professional Learning focussed on Critical and Creative Thinking Skills (\$3500) to support student learning in this area.

The Library program for students in Years 3 to 6 will be team teaching to promote project-based and enquiry learning.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT (continued)

STEAM

2019 has seen the employment of a dedicated music teacher for all students K-6

In 2019 we will begin to coordinate and set up a maker space / STEAM room with access to robotics, green screen, 3D printer, electronic Lego etc.

In 2019 we have allocated \$50000 to technology resources and support in integrating technology across the school.

Parent Portal access on Sentral

This week, Kindergarten students and new students to our school received a letter home to parents regarding how to access their parent portal. The parent portal allows parents to see information concerning their child, receive emails regarding attendance and to book interview times with teachers.

Just a reminder to all parents if you do not have access to the parent portal, let your child's teacher know and they will send a letter home for you to join. Also if at any time there are any parents who would like to have a separate access code to the portal due to family circumstance, this can also be arranged by letting your child's class teacher know. We are encouraging all families to make sure they have access to the portal as we are soon to be holding parent teacher interviews.

Parent/Teacher Interviews

Each year there is an opportunity for you to more formally meet with your child's classroom teacher to discuss their progress and achievements. This year our Parent/Teacher interviews will be held on one day/evening Monday 8 April 2019. Parentswill be able to book an interview time with their child's class teacher through the Parent Portal on Sentral. There will be various times available to you throughout this day and evening. The Parent Portal will be open from Thursday 28 March at 9am and will close on Thursday 4 April at 9pm. If you are unable to access this information through the Parent Portal, please let your child's class teacher know and they will book you an interview time.

2019 NAPLAN ONLINE – INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy – important skills that each child needs to succeed in school and life. The NAPLAN tests are designed to help us make sure students are on track with their literacy and numeracy development. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in NAPLAN tests for reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Between Tuesday 14 May and Friday 24 May, our school will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format. SCHOOL BANKING - COMMISSION

Thanks to the fantastic efforts of our students we have raised \$2,767.00 for our school through the School Banking Contributions Program in 2018. Early this year we received our Annual Contribution of \$330.00.

These funds will go towards the purchase of valuable resources for the children and our school. Ryde East Public School benefits from the activity of our school bankers by receiving commission on a Regular Savers Contribution of \$5 for every 10 School Banking deposits processed per student and an Annual Contribution each calendar year when the first School Banking deposit is processed. The amount paid is based on the number of students who made at least one School Banking deposit in the prior year.

Saving regularly is an important habit to get into, whether you're saving a little or a lot. Keep up the great work and remember, School Banking day is every Thursday.

SCHOOL BANKING FOR SIBLINGS

We were recently asked the question: "Does Ryde East Public School accept banking for "siblings"?" Brothers or Sisters not yet at Ryde East Public School or those that have moved onto other schools or High School. The answer is YES!!!

We are happy to process banking from both younger and older siblings. Older siblings will only be able to bank with us until they turn 18 (then their account will be automatically converted from a Youthsaver account and they will no longer be eligible for the school banking program). Younger sibling accounts can be set-up prior to them commencing school, then they will continue with the same student no. once they start school. If you are sending a sibling's book to school, please elastic band them together with the student book to ensure they are returned to the correct classroom.

We have a few banking days remaining in Term 1 - so make sure you submit any reward requests before the end of term. Any reward items ordered in the last 2 weeks will arrive in Term 2. If your child does not know their token balance - easy - pop a note in with your child's banking, then we can provide the token balance and eligibility for rewards.

If your child has not yet joined the School Banking program and you are interested in setting up an account for them, an account can be opened at any time throughout the year either online by visiting the CBA website at www.commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and click on the link to open a Youthsaver account or pop into your nearest CBA branch with your identification and your child's passport or birth certificate.

Reminder: Due to changes in the CBA processing system, the Thursday School Banking can only process 1 deposit per week. If we receive 2 deposits, it will processed as 1 deposit and amount adjusted accordingly.


RYDE EAST NATURAL ENVIRONMENT GROUP collected and surveyed rubbish in our school grounds on Friday 1 March which was Clean Up Australia Day For Schools.

Survey results are summarised in the graph below.

A total of 508 items of rubbish were collected, plus 23 items of lost property, which were sent to the lost property room.

Some interesting observations:

- We did not have enough time to collect all rubbish.
- Most rubbish on the bottom oval was in the vicinity of the seats at the top of the bank.
- 54 chip packets (not available at school) were found on the bottom oval.
- There was no overall decrease in rubbish found since our previous survey which was in August last year.
