SCHOOL PLAN 2018 -2020

Our school has very clear Strategic Directions that we have outlined to achieve our School Plan priorities and initiatives over the next two years. Below I have outline eour 2019 priorities for our *Strategic Direction: Sustainable Evidence-Based Practices.*



Purpose:

To enhance evidence–based pedagogy through quality teaching practices, creating classroom environments that are student–centred and optimise learning progress for all students across a full range of abilities.

Mathematics initiative

In 2018, we created an educational partnership with Anita Chin to support the implementation of Mathematics across the school (\$30000). This will continue in 2019 to support the staff in curriculum implementation and differentiation of mathematics with a whole-school approach.

In 2019, we will host a parent information evening to support this initiative.

This year we have employed Mrs Nicole Doig as a Deputy Principal Instructional Leader to mentor and support teachers in class throughout the implementation (\$23500). In 2019, we have allocated \$10000 to resourcing.

Visible Learning

In 2019 we have established a learning partnership with Corwin / John Hattie (\$25000) to support the introduction and

implementation of this initiative across K-6. The focus of this initiative will be to introduce 'Learning Intentions and Success Criteria', have students set individual learning goals, and receive explicit feedback about their learning. This initiative will be done in partnership with Gladesville PS and Mowbray PS and is a three year commitment.

English

In 2019, we have allocated \$10000 to resourcing our English programs with quality literature and quality texts for guided reading.

CYBER SAFETY

It is very important to be vigilant in the area of cyber safety. The eSafety Commission has reported that their research indicates "81% of parents hand their child an internet-connected device by the age of 4, so active parent engagement and oversite of a child's online activities is critical from the start. As children often do not have the maturity or judgement to cope with confronting content online, it is important to guide and instil critical reasoning skills, so that they are aware that not everything they see or receive online is real".



We encourage parents to co-view, co-play, ask questions about the games and apps they are using, and let them know you are there to support them if they are upset or uncomfortable about anything they see online.

The eSafety Commission has put out five top tips to help limit your child's exposure to harmful content online:

- Engage in your child's online activities ask what apps, sites and games they're using and make sure they're age-appropriate
- Use parental controls on devices to help limit what your child is exposed to
- Let them know not everything they see online is real or true
- Help them report and block upsetting content they see on social media sites or apps
- Let them know they can come to you about anything upsetting they see online, and contact Kids Helpline if they need further support.

NAPLAN

This year our students In Years 3 and 5 will be participating in NAPLAN online. NAPLAN online may be run over a two week period from Tuesday 14 May to Friday 24 May. We will notify you closer to the time of the exact dates that our school will be undertaking the assessment.

Congratulations to all the Kindergarten students for how they have settled into school and their new routine. They are all working very hard and their teachers are extremely proud of them all. There will be a few things coming home next week that we need parents to be on the look out for:

- **Best Start Feedback Report** Each child will bring home their report next Monday 11 March. This report will provide you with an overview of the things they could do in literacy and numeracy at the start of Kindergarten when we met for the Best Start Interview. It will also inform you of the sorts of things they will be learning in these areas now they are at school.
- **Home Reading** Each child will bring home a blue home reading card that you can sign for each night of reading. This term we are only expecting the students to listen to a story you have read to them. This could be a book from home or from the library. Whilst reading you can encourage them to follow the words with you, talk about the pictures and what is happening with the characters. This card will stay in their folder at home until the 25 nights are completed.
- **Sight Words** The children will be bringing home a sheet of sight words. Some of them we have already learnt and the rest we will continue to focus on over the term. We encourage you to review these at home. Once they can read them all they will return them to their classroom teacher ready for the next level of words.
- **News** All parents should have received their news topics and their child's news day. This starts from next week too.

If you have any questions or concerns about any of these things please come and discuss with your child's teacher. We are more than happy to assist you.

SPOTLIGHT ON TEACHING AND LEARNING



At REPS our staff value creating engaging learning environments where all students experience success. Professional learning centred around high quality teaching and learning in mathematics has been a focus of Strategic Direction 1, providing staff with continuous growth in pedagogical understandings. Caring classroom communities that work towards achieving mathematical goals to improve student learning outcomes are being developed through:

* A Focus on Differentiation - Differentiation is the way in which teachers meet the needs of the diversity of students in their class. Teachers may differentiate the content, processes, product and environment to support all learners in the classroom. They pose different questions and provide point in time feedback to ensure all students can engage in all learning activities in a personalised way. Our teachers are continually researching and developing their skills in differentiated practice.

*Collegiality among staff in the development of K-6 a scope and sequence of learning – Teachers work collaboratively to develop units of work that foster deep understanding of developmental sequences of learning. Classroom programs ensure students are supported in creating connections between different ways of solving problems, between mathematical representations and topics, and between mathematics and everyday experiences. Teaching and learning activities focus on tasks that are hands-on, practical and encourage students to think and work both independently and collaboratively, ask questions and take risks.

As a parent you can help by talking positively about mathematics and asking questions that relate to real world situations. Shared experiences involving cooking, measuring, counting, using money, dice games etc... will help to develop your child's mathematical understanding in the real world. LIBRARY NEWS

A quick reminder that the NSW premiers reading challenge began on Monday 4 March. We are encouraging all students to participate. On **Monday 11 March at 3:30pm** I will be running a parent workshop to assist anyone with using the Premiers Reading Challenge website.

I have changed a few things in the Library this year to help students with updating their PRC log. I have placed a worm that will have all PRC codes accompanying books that we have read in the library, this allows students to be able to place these codes onto their PRC log.

Once your child has completed the PRC, a special mention will be put in the newsletter and their name will be written on a star and put on the hall of fame.



PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Tips for parents and carers for participating in the Challenge :

- Familiarise yourself with the new PRC student website. There is a video on the PRC Support site that you can watch that demonstrates how to login, search for books and add them to a Student Reading Record (SRR).
- Visit the Premier's Reading Challenge Support website. It allows you to search for information about the PRC and how to use the PRC website and also how to contact the PRC team.
- Set reminders for Challenge opening and closing dates in both your and your child's calendas.
- Find out your child's logon details. For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to access computers and the internet at school. Non-government students will need to contact the PRC Coordinator at their school if they cannot remember their login details.
- Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2 Challenge.
- Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record regularly.
- Follow The Arts Unit on Facebook and the NSW PRC on Instagram to keep up to date about information about the Challenge throughout the year. We regularly run contests and Author events your child may be interested in taking part in.

Contact your child's PRC coordinator. Mrs Karevski:

- Your child has any difficulty using her/his logon details to access the PRC website.
- You are concerned that your child's name is spelt incorrectly in the PRC website.
- If you need to check your child's Challenge history, please contact your child's PRC coordinator.

Your child's online Student Reading Record must have the required number of books recorded to complete the Challenge by the student closing date. School PRC coordinators have an extra two weeks to validate the SRR. **Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate**.

In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your child's SRR. Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been validated.
