
LIGHT UP EAST RYDE

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

THANK YOU TO THE P&C AND SCHOOL COMMUNITY



Due to the ongoing support of the P&C and your ongoing support and commitment, the P&C were able to support the school with a fundraising amount of \$48 000. \$40 000 of these funds, along with additional school funds, has been used to purchase new Interactive Panels for each of our classrooms, including the Library and current Computer room. P&C Funds of \$5000 have also gone towards purchasing PBEL signage for various locations around the school (which we are hoping to have installed by the end of the year) and \$3000 for a sporting program and laptop to support our school carnivals. Thank you to everyone for supporting P&C run events and fundraising activities. Without your ongoing support, this would not be possible. A huge thank you to the P&C executive team and many parent volunteers for your continued and ongoing support. It is much appreciated.


