PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Anti-bullying National day of action will take place on **Friday 16 March**. At Ryde East Public School we will be acknowledging this day and



addressing anti-bullying through a variety of ways. Class teachers will be conducting lessons that focus on positive behaviours and addressing topics, such as 'What makes us unique?', 'How do we make friends?', 'What is diversity?' and 'What is bullying?'

Students who participate in PSSA sport can bring their sports clothes to change into or just wear a touch of blue with their sport attire.

Lunch tubs have been purchased for each of the classrooms so that students can place their lunch boxes and drink bottles into these tubs for them to be stored inside the classroom during the day. At present a lot of our bag hooks (where students hang their bags) are outside the classrooms and can be in direct sunlight. To alleviate concerns around lunches spoiling, they will be kept inside the classroom in these lunch tubs. School bags will remain hung on the hooks outside the classrooms, or in their usual designated place.

Just a reminder that students can be at school from 8:45am in the morning. There is a teacher

supervising the playground from this time. If students arrive prior to this time, they are to sit on the silver seat outside the Kindergarten classrooms. If possible, please drop your child off and leave the school prior to the morning bell, so that students can line up and transition smoothly into class. Kiss and ride can also be used in the mornings before school.

We encourage and appreciate parents volunteering at events and throughout the year in classrooms. Legally we are required to obtain documentation to ensure that you are able to volunteer at the school. There will be a note coming home next Tuesday (13/3) with an attachment (Appendix 5) that is required to be completed annually if you are volunteering at school. This form must be completed and returned to the front office (in person) with 100 points of ID, prior to you volunteering. Without this documentation completed and up-to-date unfortunately you will not be able to volunteer.

If you have a current Working With Children Check through Service NSW or have completed a volunteer check through Service NSW, this does cover you for volunteering, however you are required to produce this documentation to the office.

Just a reminder to monitor your children's devices. With many students on social media and having access to the internet readily through their phones, please ensure that you are aware of what they are viewing and conversations they are having to ensure it is appropriate and safe.

LIBRARY NEWS

The official launch date is Monday 5 March for the NSW Premiers Reading Challenge (PRC). PRC aims to encourage children to read quality literature from a wide variety of authors. Please check the rules for the Challenge on the website

http://www.premiersreadingchallenge.nsw.edu.au

The books in the school library have been given a colour coded sticker to assist with finding books that are part of the Challenge. Inside the front cover you will find the PRC ID number to assist with entering the data online. All students will be encouraged to borrow one book that is part of the Challenge each week. Parents are welcome to visit the library if they have any questions.

Once a book has been read, visit the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge website. Students should use their school username and password to log on. If computer access is difficult, a personal reading log on will be provided on paper and assistance will be given to enter the data.

Students in K-2 must read 30 books, 25 from the PRC booklist and 5 personal choices. PRC books read to the class by a teacher or read to the student by their parent will count towards their total. Students who may be reading above their grade level will be required to change their challenge level to Y3-4 or Y5-6 for their books to be counted towards their challenge. This needs to be done by their teacher librarian.

Students in Years 3-6 must read 20 books, 15 from the PRC booklist and five personal choices. If reading from a series of books only two titles may be counted. Books from the appropriate level should be chosen and more capable readers can choose some titles from a higher level.

Let's break the record this year. Last year 285 students completed the PRC and in 2016, 151 students. Let's keep on breaking the record and happy reading.



MUSIC PROGRAM FEES

We have had some queries with regards to the \$100 fee. This is a fee that covers a number of the costs associated with the running of the music program and it is payable by all students. It helps us cover activities such as the Music Day (pizza lunch is included), Musical Variety Night, entry fees for competitions, purchases of music scores, notebooks and the purchase of new instruments and equipment. Even if your child is not in an ensemble/band, they still participate in the music day and the musical variety night.

TUTOR FEES

Tutor fees are due within two weeks from the date of invoice and are payable for the whole of the term. There are no refunds or credits issued unless the tutor has missed a lesson. Notice to cease lessons for term 2 must be received by week 8 of this term.

GOLD CARD PERFORMANCE – Senior String Ensemble

Our Senior String Ensemble will be performing at the Week 8 Gold Card Assembly – Friday 23 March. I am very much looking forward to hearing our senior string players perform. They will have a very busy term 2 and are currently preparing for their performance at The Sydney Opera House for the Festival of Instrumental Music on the 20 May.

MUSIC PRACTICE CLUB IS BACK!

All children in the music program have received a practice card. This is to be used for our music practice reward scheme. It is very similar to the readers club, providing an incentive for children to practise and, in turn, gain confidence in their instrument. Please read the back of the card

carefully for an explanation of how the club works and for recommended practice times for different experience levels. Only an adult can sign the card after the practice session is done. When the card is full, it should go in the box covered in musical notes in the school office labelled 'Music Practice Club'. You can get the next card (e.g. 26-50 practice sessions, and so on) from the music drawer in the office. Prizes will be given out at the Week 3 and 7 assemblies. Next week is Week 7, so if you have done 25 practice sessions, have the signed card with name, class and instrument written on it, in the box by Wednesday 14 March. Please use this scheme to help encourage your children to practise regularly and you will find they have much more fun as they improve. Extra practice cards can be found in the Music Drawer.

MUSIC DAY

Music Day will be Sunday 6 May and **all students** in the music program will be invited. There'll be lots of exciting activities, special workshops and games with our wonderful tutors, finishing off with an afternoon performance for family and friends. This is an important day for all our bands and ensembles to attend, with the Performance and REPS Bands finetuning their pieces for the Ryde East Music Festival and the Wahroonga Festival competitions, and the Recorder and Senior Strings preparing for their performance at the Sydney Opera House in Term 2. WEEK 5 REPORT

This week was our fifth week into the school term, building the relationships between the children and the staff at the centre. This past week reinforced our desire to encourage children's choice throughout all programming; from the menu of additional breakfast and afternoon tea to also outdoor activities' and craft. Various sporting activities were programmed to keep the children active and entertained. These activities differed from day-to-day and included free play on the oval, cricket, volleyball, games under the COLA and equipment play. 



How to enter books online for the Premier's Reading Challenge...

Step 1: Enter the following website into your browser https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html

Step 2: From the left menu items, select 'Logon'. This will redirect you to a page that asks for

your child's logon details.



Step 3: Enter your child's username and password and select '**log in**'. These details are the same as what your child uses to logon to the computers at school.

Log in with your DoE account
Enter your user ID
Example: jane.citizen1
Enter your password


Step 4: You will now be back on the PRC website. At the top of the page you will see that your child has been logged in.



Step 5: From the left menu items, select 'Student Reading Records'.



Step 6: Follow the instructions outlined on this page to enter the books your child has read or you have read to your child.



 The easiest way to enter a PRC book from the library is to type in the ID number and click 'Add'. All the other details of the book will automatically appear.



- The ID number of a PRC book from our school library can be found on the inside cover of the book.
- It's easy to enter a PRC book from your home library too! Just fill in the 'Title' and 'Author' and click 'Add'.
- To check if a book you have at home is part of the PRC, select 'Booklist' from the left menu items and search accordingly.
- Your child's library teacher will also be adding books in as they are read during school time.

We are very excited to have as many children as possible completing the Premier's Reading Challenge for 2017.

It is a great initiative to foster a love of reading independently and as a shared experience.
